- 3 - In many cases, earlier or later emergence can take place, listed is the normal peak times, when concentrations are normally heaviest.

- 5 - Approximate earliest day of the month to latest day of the month observed
- 6 - also known as Tiny Black Gold Speckled-Winged Caddis
- 7 - also known as Early Smoky Wing Sedge
- 8 - also known as Dark Hendrickson, Whirling Dunn
- 9 - also known as Small Dark Quill
- 10 - also known as Shad Fly, Popcorn, Grannom
- 11 - almost identical to Little Dark Hendrickson¹⁵ *Ephemerella needhami* except for their smaller size
- 12 - also known as Black Caddis
- 13 - also known as Ginger Caddis
- 14 - also known as Ginger Quills
- 15 - best imitated by a dark red quill
- 16 - formerly *Stenonema fuscum* - Despite now being taxonomically classed with the March Brown as *Maccaffertium vicarium*, is a different animal.
- 17 - also known as Mahogany Dun, White-Gloved Howdy
- 18 - also known as Great Brown Stone
- 19 - also known as Embossed Stonefly
- 20 - also known as Orange Sulphur
- 21 - Susquehanna River renowned White Fly hatch for Smallmouth bass - Not known to have this hatch on club waters
- 22 - also known as Little Yellow Quill
